1 (A) read to the candidate the constitutional and statutory  
2 requirements for the office; and

3 (B) ask the candidate whether or not the candidate meets the  
4 requirements.

5 (ii) If the candidate cannot meet the requirements of office, the  
6 filing officer may not accept the write-in candidate's declaration of  
7 candidacy.

8 (2) A write-in candidate in cities of the second and third class and  
9 towns need not prequalify with the filing officer.

10 Section 72. Section 53A-3-101, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as last  
11 amended by Chapter 226, Laws of Utah 1992, is amended to read:

12 53A-3-101. Membership -- Qualifications -- Election requirements --  
13 Term of office.

14 (1) Unless otherwise required by Section 53A-3-102 or 53A-3-103, the  
15 Salt Lake City Board of Education shall consist of seven members and the  
16 boards of education of all other districts shall consist of five members.  
17 One member shall be elected from each [precinct] school representative  
18 district.

19 (2) A member of a local school board must be and remain a resident  
20 and a qualified and registered elector of the school representative  
21 [precinct] district from which the member is elected or appointed.

22 (3) No more than three members may be elected to a five-member  
23 board, nor more than four members to a seven-member board, in any  
24 election year, unless otherwise required as a consequence of  
25 reapportionment or to fill a vacancy under Section 53A-3-104.
