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School Accountability

The Utah State Legislature has mandated a new accountability system that requires letter grades for each school. Unfortuantely, these simple letter grades can't and don't tell the full story. Our goal with this webpage is to publicly publish these grades as we are reuqired to do, but to also show you where you can find comprehesive and complete data about your schools. All Salt Lake City schools have successes and challenges. A single letter grade can't accurately tell their stories.

Where can you find accurate, comprehensive information about your school?

The best and most comprehesive review of your school is found in its School Improvement Plan. These plans feature charts and data showing student test scores and what steps your school is taking to improve. It shows how money is being used to address areas of weakness, and the plan will show how the school is succeeding. School Improvement Plans are developed and written by the school and the school community council. They are updated each year. What other information is available?

If you would like a general overview of your school, try visiting the school's website. Each school in Salt Lake City has a website to help parents, students, and the community to find basic information. Go to our School Websites page and you will be taken to a list of all Salt Lake City School. Clicking on the school name will get you basic information about each school. You can then click on the school website link in the gray box on the right and be taken directly to the school's website.

What do I need to know about the new school grading system?

Utah had one of the most comprehensive school accountability systems in the nation. The Utah Comprehesive Accountability System (UCAS) included dozens of pages of data for each school in the state. It was reviewed and approved by the U.S. Department of Education. However, some in the Utah Legislaure felt parents were not capable of handling so much information. They designed an additional system that assigns each school only a single grade.

- The UCAS reports and the School Grading reports measure academic performance of Utah schools in language arts and math (beginning in grade 3), and science (beginning in grade 4). For high schools, graduation rate is also included. No other aspects of school performance are considered in either the UCAS or School Grading report.
- Not all grades and subjects are included in UCAS or School Grading due to the fact that not all grades and courses have statewide tests. Some subjects without statewide teste are social studies, world languages, fine arts, health/PE, and advanced math such as calculus.
- Rigorous courses such as AP and IB are also not included in high school UCAS and School Grading calculations.
- Factors such as student engagement, school climate, progression toward graduation, concurrent enrollment, CTE coursework etc. are also not included in UCAS and School Grading calculations.
